The Church at Thessalonica

Paul and Silas traveled to city called Thessalonica (thess-uh-luh-NIKE-uh). While they were there, Paul met lots of people. He read to them from scripture. He taught them that Jesus was God's son and the ruler of the world. Many of the people believed in Jesus.

But some of the people didn't like what Paul was saying. Jesus was a ruler? No! *They* wanted to be in charge! Some people tried to hurt Paul. Others complained to their leaders: "Only the Emperor should be our ruler!" There were a lot of big feelings about Jesus.

Even though many people tried to stop the story of Jesus from spreading, more and more people believed. The churches grew. It was very hard—even dangerous!—to be a Christian. But Jesus' love made them strong.


